

## Sports Premium Background



Most schools with primary-age pupils receive the Physical Education and Sport Premium in the academic year 2023 to 2024.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that you should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
  - make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years, for example, you can use your funding to:
    - hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
    - provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
    - introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
    - support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
    - run sport competitions
    - increase pupils' participation in the School Games
    - run sports activities with other schools
- School must still teach the minimum requirements of the national curriculum - including those specified for swimming (or, in the case of academies and free schools, to teach your existing PE curriculum) from their base budgets.

## 2023-2024 - School share of sports premium (Impact in green)



Our aims:

ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. In order to embed our previous aims and objectives we are continuing to have these as our key foci.

Objective: To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools against 8 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity consequently kick-starting healthy active lifestyles Sports clubs on offer with options for all year groups to participate. Sports council members and lunch time staff have developed activities throughout the year at lunch times. 100% of children have participated in inter-house competitions in school and personal challenges within their PE sessions.
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement TAs and ECTs have been upskilled as a result of additional CPD. PE lead has supported teachers in implementations of a new planning scheme, PE lead has delivered CPD during staff meetings and has been released to observe and team teach with staff.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport Lessons are effective and at least good. TAs able to effectively deliver PE sessions and this is part of our sustainable use of the premium. Two upskilled TAs have successfully completed training to enhance their delivery of PE.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils New sports/activities were tried during Kingswood residential. Including orienteering, hiking, climbing. A wider range of sports festivals/activities will be accessed next academic year via T&WSSP
5. Increased participation inter school sport events for KS1 100% of EYFS and KS1 children have participated in inter house competitions in school.
6. Increased sports club provision for children, which is accessed by at least 75% of pupils in the first 3 years (to 2023), growing to 90% thereafter. 43% of children accessing sports clubs - a growth of 3% from the last report. Need to engage more external providers to widen this, but space to run them and availability of coaches has been a barrier this year.
7. Improve the sports equipment in our new school. Sports equipment is good and has been refreshed over this year and has been provided for playtimes with KS2 children running structured games/activities.
8. Achieve a school games mark in the 'Summer Term' 2024. We have achieved the gold school games mark.
